ROME

- **Colosseum** The Colosseum is the largest amphitheatre built during the Roman Empire. Inaugurated in 80 AD, it offered gladiator fights, executions and animal hunts.
- **Trevi Fountain** Is a fountain in the Trevi district in Rome, Italy, designed by Italian architect Nicola Salvi and completed by Pietro Bracci. It is the largest Baroque fountain in the city and one of the most famous fountains in the world.
- **Spanish Steps shopping** The area around Piazza di Spagna is always buzzing with shoppers, tourists and Rome's elite. The Spanish Steps, one of Rome's main attractions.

VATICAN CITY

- **St Peter's Basilica** Is a church built in the Renaissance style located in Vatican City, the papal enclave that is within the city of Rome, Italy.
- St. Peter's Square is a large plaza located directly in front of St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican City, the papal enclave inside Rome, directly west of the neighborhood or rione of Borgo.

POMPEII

• **Pompeii** - Once a thriving and sophisticated Roman city, Pompeii was buried under meters of ash and pumice after the catastrophic eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 A.D. The preserved site features excavated ruins of streets and houses that visitors can freely explore.

SIENA

• **Siena** - a city in central Italy's Tuscany region, is distinguished by its medieval brick buildings. The fan-shaped central square, Piazza del Campo, is the site of the Palazzo Pubblico, the Gothic town hall, and Torre del Mangia, a slender 14th-century tower with sweeping views from its distinctive white crown. The city's 17 historic "contrade" (districts) extend outward from the piazza.

PISA

• Leaning Tower - Pisa is a city in Italy's Tuscany region best known for its iconic Leaning Tower. Already tilting when it was completed in 1372, the 56m white-marble cylinder is the bell tower of the Romanesque, striped-marble cathedral that rises next to it in the Piazza dei Miracoli.

CINQUE TERRE

• **Cinque Terre** - an enchanting xluater of villages perched on the rugged peaks along the Italian Riviera coastline. Begin with Monterosso al Mare, the largest of the five villages and embark on a Train ride (or boat ride) ro manarola. Take a jaunt down the Via dell'Amore, otherwise known as the "Pathway of Love," and enjoy the beautiful landscapes and amorous grafitti along the path.

FLORENCE

- Florence Cathedral is the cathedral of Florence, Italy. It was begun in 1296 in the Gothic style to a design of Arnolfo di Cambio and was structurally completed by 1436.
- **The Gates of Paradise** is the main gate of the Baptistry of Florence (Battistero di San Giovanni), located in front of the Cathedral.
- **Piazza della Signoria** Is an L-shaped square in front of the Palazzo Vecchio in Florence, Italy. It is the focal point of the origin and of the history of the Florentine Republic and still maintains its reputation as the political hub of the city.
- **Ponte Vecchio** is known for the many shops on and around the bridge, which used to be the domain of blacksmiths, tanners and butchers.
- **The Mall** is the most famous shopping outlet in Tuscany, specialising in Italian and international designers. Luxury outlet stores.

• **Piazza Maggiore** - is a central square in Bologna, region of Emilia-Romagna, Italy. The appearance in the 21st century, generally reflects the layout from the 15th century.

Milan Cathedral

- **Basilica of San Petronio** dedicated to the city's patron saint, is located in Piazza Maggiore and is the largest and most important church in Bologna.
- **Fountain of Neptune** is a model example of Mannerist taste of the Italian courtly elite in the mid-sixteenth century.

VENICE

- The Bridge of Sighs Is a bridge located in Venice, northern Italy. The enclosed bridge is made of white limestone and has windows with stone bars. It passes over the Rio di Palazzo and connects the New Prison to the interrogation rooms in the Doge's Palace
- St Mark's Square is the principal public square of Venice, Italy, where it is generally known just as la Piazza. All other urban spaces in the city are called campi.
- **St Mark's Basilica** is the cathedral church of the Roman Catholic Patriarchate of Venice; it became the episcopal seat of the Patriarch of Venice in 1807, replacing the earlier cathedral of San Pietro di Castello.
- **Glass Blowing Factory** Discover the art of glass blowing in the heart of Venice! See a master artisan at work to find out how the glass is made.

MILAN

- **Sforza Castle** is a medieval fortification located in Milan, northern Italy. It was built in the 15th century by Francesco Sforza, Duke of Milan, on the remnants of a 14thcentury fortification. Later renovated and enlarged, in the 16th and 17th centuries it was one of the largest citadels in Europe
- Milan Cathedral is the cathedral church of Milan, Lombardy, Italy. Dedicated to the Nativity of St Mary, it is the seat of the Archbishop of Milan, currently Archbishop Mario Delpini.
- The Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II is the world's oldest shopping mall, the Galleria is named after Victor Emmanuel II, the first king of the Kingdom of Italy.
